24 A. Requests to release exhibits are to go to the judicial officer who tried the case if the
25 case is not final. In cases that are final, requests shall go to the Presiding Judge.

1 B. Orders submitted for signature are to go to the judicial officer who made the order.
2 However, if made by a visiting judge or an unavailable judicial officer, then it should
3 be routed pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure §635, as follows:

4 (i) to the Supervising Judge of the division in which the unavailable judicial officer
5 presided; or

6 (ii) to the Presiding Judge.

7 C. Any proposed order amending or correcting a prior order is to go to the judicial
8 officer who made the order in question, subject to II(B).

9 D. In the event a judicial officer is disqualified or unavailable, or if the parties do not
10 stipulate to a commissioner, the matter will be referred to the Supervising Judge of
11 the division for reassignment.

12 **III.** Matters requiring emergency judicial action are to be referred to the Clerk's Office
13 for routing in accordance herewith. The Clerk's Office will ask the party presenting
14 the document to wait while it is being processed. The clerk will alert the judicial
15 officer that the attorney, party, or messenger is waiting.

16 **IV.** Assignments to Judges Lucena, Keithley, Benson and Candela are for all purposes,
17 within the meaning of Code of Civil Procedure §170.6(2). Additionally, any
18 assignments to Judges Deems, McLean, Forland, Reilley, Mosbarger, Glusman,
19 Roberts, and Commissioners Gunn and Goldkind as a result of a disqualification,
20 recusal, or unavailability of another judicial officer, will be assignments for all
21 purposes, within the meaning of Code of Civil Procedure §170.6(2), effective upon
22 the first court appearance before that judicial officer.
