

### Questions and Answers for DRPA RFP

<b>Date of Response</b>	<b>Question</b>	<b>Answer</b>
3/29/12	The RFP states that the Coordinator intends to award a 3 year contract. We cannot commit to three years worth of matching funds. In the introduction section, it is stated that the contract will include a "funding availability" term. Can you provide further clarification of that term? Does that mean DRPA funding availability or the funding availability for the applicants, as well? Is there any way to apply for DRPA funding just for the remainder of 2012?	The intent is to award a multiyear contract, contingent on the proposer's ability to secure adequate matching funding for each year. Proposers who are currently unable to commit to three years worth of matching funds are still eligible to submit a responsive proposal (with the understanding that any contract that may be awarded to proposers in this situation may be terminated in the future if the proposer is unable to provide the appropriate matching funds for the future years of the contract). Contract term details will be finalized during the contract negotiation process with the successful proposer(s).
3/29/12	Nonprofits cannot comply with the current wording as described in the insurance requirements. Can this language be amended to reflect our nonprofit status if we are the successful bidder?	Yes. Contract details will be finalized during the contract negotiation phase with the successful proposer(s).
