15 II. The following general principles are applicable in referring matters pursuant to these
16 assignments:

17 A. Orders submitted for signature shall be routed to the judicial officer who made
18 the order. If the judicial officer who made the order is unavailable, then it
19 shall be routed pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure §635, as follows:

20 (i) to the Supervising Judge of the division in which the unavailable judicial
21 officer presided; or

22 (ii) to the Presiding Judge.

23 For the purposes of this section, a judge is unavailable for signature if the
24 judge is away from the court for more than five (5) consecutive Court days.

27 III. The following general principles apply when determining reassignment after a
28 disqualification of judicial officer:

- A. In the event a judicial officer is disqualified, or if the parties do not stipulate to a Commissioner (if required), the case shall be referred to the Supervising Judge of the division for reassignment, with exception of the following:
 - a. If the Supervising Judge is disqualified, the case shall be referred to the Presiding Judge for reassignment.
 - b. If the Presiding Judge is disqualified the case shall be referred to the Assistant Presiding Judge for reassignment, pursuant to CCP170.3(a)(2).
 - c. If the Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court is disqualified, the case shall be referred to the Presiding Judge for reassignment.
 - d. In divisions where only two Judges preside, if one is disqualified, the case shall be reassigned to the Judge who has not been disqualified. This shall also apply to the Criminal Misdemeanor assignments.
 - e. In the Criminal Division, by this order, cases shall be reassigned according to Exhibit B.

- B. Assignments of non-Criminal cases are for all purposes, within the meaning of Code of Civil Procedure §170.6(a)(2). Assignments of non-Criminal cases as a result of a disqualification, recusal or unavailability of another judicial officer, will be assignments for all purposes, within the meaning of Code of Civil Procedure §170.6(a)(2).

- C. Assignments of Criminal cases are for all purposes within the meaning of Code of Civil Procedure §170.6(a)(2) effective upon the first court appearance on the criminal calendar of the assigned judge. Assignments of Criminal cases as a result of a disqualification, recusal, or unavailability of another judicial officer, will be assignments for all purposes, within the meaning of Code of Civil Procedure §170.6(a)(2), effective upon the first court appearance before that judicial officer.

- D. If, at the felony trial assignment calendar, a jury trial is assigned to a trial judge other than the previously assigned felony alpha judge, the parties will

1 have the right to exercise a peremptory challenge pursuant to Code of Civil
2 Procedure §170.6(a)(2) as to the newly assigned trial judge, unless the party
3 has previously exercised a peremptory challenge in the matter.

4 E. In the event that all judicial officers are disqualified, the matter shall be heard
5 by a visiting judge.

7 IV. Pursuant to Section 246 of the Welfare and Institutions Code of the State of
8 California, Judges Stephen E. Benson, Michael P. Candela, Michael R. Deems,
9 Robert A. Glusman, Clare Keithley, Kristen A. Lucena, Sandra L. McLean, Kimberly
10 Merrifield, Tamara L. Mosbarger, Barbara L. Roberts and Jesus A. Rodriguez are
11 designated as Judges of the Juvenile Court.
